# Narrative:

One of my first responsibilities at UT Dallas was to create a new education course, *Curriculum Practice. Curriculum Practice* related curriculum theory to the concerns of beginning teachers and prepared them for state certification exams. In the spring semester of 2000, *Curriculum Practice* became the first UT Dallas education course taught on Saturday mornings. I supervised student teachers for three semesters (spring and fall 2000, and spring 2001).

In the fall of 2001, the Chess in Education Courses launched, with three-credit undergraduate and graduate courses offered. I have been teaching the "Chess I" (ED 4358 and ED 5344) courses in the sequence since 2001. I began teaching both courses (ED 4359 and ED 5345) of "Chess II" in the fall of 2007 and continue to also teach both Chess I courses. Since the fall of 2010, the courses have been offered through UT Dallas eLearning.

In the spring of 2015, the graduate courses ED 5344 and ED 5345 were discontinued. In the fall of 2017 through the fall of 2018, two sections of Chess I (ED 4358) and one section of Chess II (ED 4359) were offered every fall and spring semester. Starting in the spring of 2019, one section of ED 4358 and one section of ED 4359 will be offered in the fall, spring, and summer.
